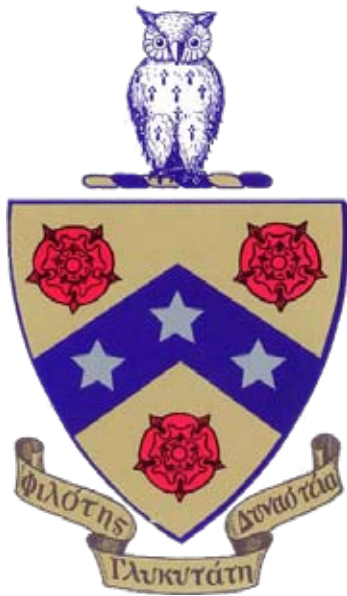

After transferring from San Diego State University in 1949, Frank pledged in the fall of his first semester. He lived in the house for all of the three years that he studied at the University. His calling in life, chemistry, took up much of his time in the lab, though he still managed to hold important positions in the house, solidifying his status as a leader among his peers.

Proudly a member of a true Fiji family, Frank's father was a member of the Alpha Iota Chapter at Iowa State University, and Frank's brother Bob was also a member of our own Delta Xi chapter of the class of 1957. Frank remembers Fiji as the foundation for lifelong friends and for the greatest memories he has of his time at Cal. Frank has taken it upon himself to organize a Fiji trip to Carmel for his brothers of the classes '48-'53 for the last ten years and counting; a clear demonstration of his love and dedication to the house.
